In order to support Sigfox's global expansion, Ludovic Le Moan has raised a total €277 million round of financing from strategic and financial investors in Europe, the U.S. and Asia.

He has been involved in the machine-to-machine space since 2000, when he co-founded Anyware Technologies, which enabled the connection, management and monitoring of remote equipment through a Web interface.

After selling Anyware Technologies to Wavecom in 2008, Ludovic Le Moan co-founded Goojet, a B2C services company that offered a simple, personal experience of the mobile web and allowed users to share and exchange messages and content. He served as COO of the company, now repositioned as scoop.it, from February 2008 to March 2011.

Earlier in his career, he held a variety of scientific and business positions. He spent four years with COFRAMI Group, a 1,500-employee computer engineering and software solutions company serving the aerospace, telecommunications, IT, defense and other industries. He was general director when he left to found Anyware Technologies.

Le Moan is a serial entrepreneur who also founded "IoT Valley", a Toulouse, France, association that offers mentoring, networking and other support for startups in the Internet of Things.

He received an engineering degree from ENSIMAG (Grenoble Institute of Technology), a leading French school in computer science, applied mathematics and telecommunications.

He was appointed Chevalier de la Légion d'honneur in 2016.



Joseph LUBIN

Joseph Lubin is a co-founder of blockchain computing platform Ethereum and the founder of Consensus Systems (ConsenSys), a blockchain venture studio. His topic was related to the calculation and the measurement of perturbative corrections to Quantum Chromodynamics processes which influence the search of new signals in the high energy region that is studied at LHC. He was also involved in the analysis of detector noises in the ATLAS experiment and the development of new algorithms to catch them efficiently.

Nicolas realises that this technology would disrupt the way companies are processing their daily data if he could get it out of the academic sphere to make it accessible to domain experts who haven't any Data Science education.

He founded DreamQuark in 2014 with the objective of developing Brain, a software platform that automates model training based on Deep Learning and allows an easy deployment, quick to meet the daily needs of companies in financial and health sectors.

In 2016, He created DreamUp Vision developing a cognitive learning engine which relies on deep-learning technologies. DreamUp Vision enables detecting at their earlier stage diabetic retinopathies, major cause of blindness in the working-age population. The algorithm can identify on his own the forerunner of the disease by detecting micro aneurysm, marks, arteries' bad conditions on fundus photography realised from an ocular fundus camera.

DreamQuark, which counts 28 employees and has raised 3 million, is frequently awarded for its innovation and Nicolas Méric has been recognized in 2017 as one of the « 10 French brains that fascinates » in the Artificial Intelligence field (source: Ailancy) by side with Yann LeCun (Facebook), Jérôme Pesenti (IBM Watson) and Emmanuel Mogenet (Google).

During her four years as Chairman, Ms. Schapiro presided over one of the busiest rule-making agendas in the SEC's history, during which the agency also executed a comprehensive restructuring program to improve protections for investors and aggressive enforcement of the federal securities laws.
